**How many people with I/DD are in jail/prison?**



The Bureau of Justice Statistics (from the United States Department of Justice) released a brief that presents findings from a 2016 survey of prison inmates. The brief details the inmates' demographics and types of disabilities reported by prisoners.

**How many people with I/DD are in general education settings?**

The Kaiser Family Foundation (KFF) tracks data on waiting lists for Medicaid and Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) as part of its State Health Facts Project.

**How many people with I/DD are unemployed in the United States?**



National Core Indicators IDD (NCI-IDD) tracks employment performance and outcome measures over time. They also have a sub-domain that determines whether people with I/DD have competitive, integrated employment.
