I/DD Counts is an initiative lead by the Administration for Community Living (ACL).

The primary goals of I/DD Counts according to ACL are:



Collecting data on the number of people with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities (I/DD) in the United States and its territories. This is known as I/DD's "prevalence".



Collecting data about the health of people with I/DD, including data about their overall health and services they use.
