Intermediate Care Facilities (ICF)



 **\$5 Billion**

In FY 2023, **\$7.4 Billion** was spent on ICF

An optional Medicaid benefit that enables states to provide personal health care and rehabilitation services to people to promote their functional status and independence. (Medicaid.gov)

Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Waivers



 **\$10 Billion**

In FY 2023, **\$38.2 Billion** was spent on HCBS

Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) provide opportunities for Medicaid users to receive services in their own home or community instead of institutions or other isolated settings. (Medicaid.gov)



 **\$10 Billion**

In FY 2023, **\$12.2 Billion** was spent on Supported Living

Supported Living

Supports funded by the state IDD agency for adults in housing arrangements that guarantee:

- Choice of where participants live and choice of housemates
- Control of the living arrangement by the person, the person's family or an organization not providing services to the person with a disability
